This is Woodbridge Mayor John McCormac and today is Friday, February 26.

The Township had 132 new cases of Coronavirus from within the general public over the last four days with 32 on Monday, 44 on Tuesday, 30 on Wednesday and 26 on Thursday. These numbers are just a slight bit above all of our recent rolling averages but they are significantly below the numbers we experienced in January into early February so we are still in a much better place.

There were no new cases in outside facilities but we unfortunately still have deaths to report of four males aged 81, 65, 62 and 57. The average age of people passing away from COVID-19 is certainly declining. Please keep all victims and their families and those who are still sick in your thoughts and prayers.

Please don't forget the guidelines of good personal hygiene, mask wearing, social distancing and limits on gatherings. Always check on your neighbors.

The limit on indoor gatherings has increased to 50% of capacity if the event is a religious service or a wedding or funeral.

We keep updating all information we can find about vaccinations and we post it all on our Township web site and social media pages.

A great big shout out to the students and teachers of Colonia Middle School which collected 2,400 pounds of food and nearly \$1,000 at their drive-thru effort at the Evergreen Senior Center last weekend. Have-A-Heart food stops were also made at John F. Kennedy High School, Avenel Middle School, Kennedy Park School 24, Wegman's, the Woodbridge Senior Billiards Club and the Woodbridge Rotary Club who all held food drives in the last weeks.

### COVID-19 VACCINE INFORMATION

#### How to Register:

Pre-register for the Covid-19 vaccine online through the NJ State Department of Health NJ Vaccine Scheduling System (NJVSS) by visiting:  
[covidvaccine.nj.gov](https://covidvaccine.nj.gov)

- KEEP CHECKING YOUR EMAIL AND JUNK MAIL. When you are eligible AND there is a vaccine clinic being held, the state will send you another email letting you know it is time for you to schedule your appointment. The email will be from "DOH-No-reply-CovidVaccine." The subject of the email will say, "COVID-19 Vaccine - Schedule Your Appointment". You will schedule an appointment by clicking on the blue link in the email saying "CLICK HERE TO SCHEDULE YOUR APPOINTMENT".
- PLEASE NOTE: The number of vaccines available may vary so you may need to check back several times if you are looking for an appointment at a specific location.

**NEED HELP?**

**No computer or email address? Here are some options:**

- Call the Woodbridge Township Senior Center Hotline at 732-726-6264 and a senior center coordinator will help you to pre-register on NJVSS.
- Call the NJ State Health Department Call Center at 855-568-0545. Once registered, people who do not have access to a computer will be notified by mail regarding their appointment.
- If you do not have an email address, speak with a responsible family member, who does have an email address, to help you with registration.
